Greetings from Grover Hill!

By the time you are reading my May article, all of our statewide testing will have been completed for the year. Students in grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 will have taken assessments in Language Arts and Mathematics, and fifth grade students also must complete an assessment in the area of Science. I am hopeful that our students put forth their best efforts and will make Grover Hill Elementary very proud!

The stakes for our third grade students are very high due to the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. Students in third grade are given a fall language arts assessment and also a similar assessment in the spring. It is hoped that students will pass one or both of these assessments. If not, students can pass an alternative assessment that is approved by the state. If a student fails to earn a passing score, the Ohio Department of Education deems them ineligible for advancement onto fourth grade. This is part of the state's plan to ensure that all students across Ohio have basic reading skills.

As we wrap up our final month of school, it is field trip time! Each one of our grade levels are

planning day trips to places such as the Toledo Zoo, the Fort Wayne Zoo, Sauder Farm & Craft Village, the Ohio Caverns, and the Ohio & Erie Canal and the Isaac Ludwig Mill. By now, teachers have sent field trip information home with each student and are in the process of collecting permission slips and payments!

The WTGHE PTO will be hosting our annual carnival day on Tuesday, May 24. This is an annual tradition that all of our students look forward to on the last day of school. I want to thank the PTO for their willingness to shoulder much of the work that carnival day requires, and for their continued support of our students. On Monday, May 23, we will be holding our awards assemblies. Awards for students in grades 1-3 will be handed out at 1:00 and grades 4-6 will receive theirs at 2:00. To round out our list of events in May, we will have an assembly hosted by legendary Harlem Globetrotter, Buff Coleman.
