## SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE Mr. Benjamin A. Winans

As we wrapped up September, the unseasonably warm temperatures made it hard to believe the fall season was coming. However, as we welcome in October evidence of the change in seasons is becoming more evident with the leaves turning and the cooler temperatures. Regardless of the season, our students and staff have settled into a good daily routine as far as the school year is concerned. I am pleased to report that the 2019-2020 school year is off to a great start. I want to thank our students, parents, and staff for assisting with the start of school and creating an educational environment in which positive outcomes can be seen. It certainly takes a group effort to get the results we are looking for and we thank all involved for their commitment to assisting our district.

I believe that to reach positive results communication from all parties is necessary. As I touched on in the opening to this month's newsletter we are beginning to see the a few weather related issues that come with the fall season which can create driving hazards. I am certain you are well aware that we have experienced a few days recently where fog has created safety concerns for our travel to school. I want to thank all those involved for their patience in dealing with the various weather situations that we encounter each day. While we cannot predict the weather, we can be sure to make proactive calls in response to the conditions that will allow our students to arrive to school safely each day.

Academically, we continue to work toward the achievement goals that are set by the Ohio Department of Education. With the recent release of the yearly report card, our administrative staff is working very closely with our teaching staff to examine the data. While Wayne Trace Local Schools as a whole performed well on many of the measures on the State report card, we will continue to find areas in which we can improve. The report card takes a snapshot of the entire district which we value, however we also strive to meet the individual needs of each student within the district.

As a reminder our school calendar includes several scheduled two-hour delays for teacher in-service, which allow our staff the opportunity to break down the report card data and really dig into it. Please note that we will have our next scheduled two-hour delay on December 13, which will be followed by additional scheduled two-hour delays on February 14, March 20 and April 24. Our busses will run two hours late on each of these Fridays with school starting two hours later than normal. We have also scheduled one full day for teacher in-service this fall which will be on October 28. We appreciate your cooperation as we use this in-service time allow us to better prepare to be certain our students are successful.

As we approach the month of November and the fall election I want to remind all stakeholders that we will have an income tax renewal on the ballot on November 5<sup>th</sup>. This income tax renewal represents three-quarters of a percent (.75%) and will allow

the district to continue to provide our students with quality education on a daily basis and keep our facilities up to date. Your continued support of our district is greatly appreciated and as always if you have questions about this election or any other facet of the district do not hesitate to contact the central office at (419) 263-2415.

In closing, I want to thank all of our students and parents for a great start to the school year. As I have conversations with our staff members I am hearing great things about the behavior, efforts and overall attitudes of our students. When students display these characteristics it makes the educational process that much easier and much more productive.
